Wide Open Doors in Hungary - The Contrast Exhibit

A very large door has been opened to us this year in Hungary. A Presbyterian youth pastor has designed a "walk through" type exhibit for students to experience the contrast of decisions they can make. Sex or abstinence, abortion or life etc... The exhibit is filled with Bible verses and ends with the Gospel. Our ministry has partnered with this along with the Police department and the national government! The schools are required to take their students through this Gospel presentation which shows that the teachings of the Bible do lead to the most satisfied and joyful life. Hundreds of thousands of students will experience it so pray for the Spirit to move and direction for how our ministry can follow up so many students.



Hungarian School

School is in full swing here around the Partin household. Joy is attending an all Hungarian Óvoda (preschool) five mornings a week. She is doing great, and we are so proud of her. She is singing songs in Hungarian and starting to speak in simple sentences. Her teachers love her, and she is thriving in this environment. Rivers just finished six weeks of intensive language school. This included four lessons each day Mon- Friday. She will take one more three week course, and then the baby will come!! I am taking lessons in the afternoons from a tutor and will attend the intensive course as soon as Rivers is done. Intensive language study will continue for all of us until the end of this school year. We would really appreciate your prayers in this area.



Our Church in Hungary

We wanted to give you an idea of what the church is like here. We decided to go to a Hungarian speaking church so we could begin building relationships while we are learning the language. We attend köszicla baptist gyülekezet (The Rock Baptist Church). We have about 70 members and meet in the community center in our city. We meet on Sunday mornings where we have great worship, teaching from the Bible, a class for Joy, and sometimes nursery for Lydia. Church is hard for us right now because we don't understand much from the sermon and sometimes it is an hour long talk. But I just started playing guitar in the worship band (I'm on the left) and am enjoying the common language of guitar chords. Pray that we find our place in serving the Hungarian Church and for revival to come.
